Daniel Foust grew up with aviation in his blood, and after earning his B.S. degree in Aviation Operations from San Jose State University, he followed his dream to earn the title U.S. Marine. For the next 9 years, Daniel served as a Combat Assault Support Helicopter Pilot, with numerous deployments around the world, including two combat tours to Iraq.
